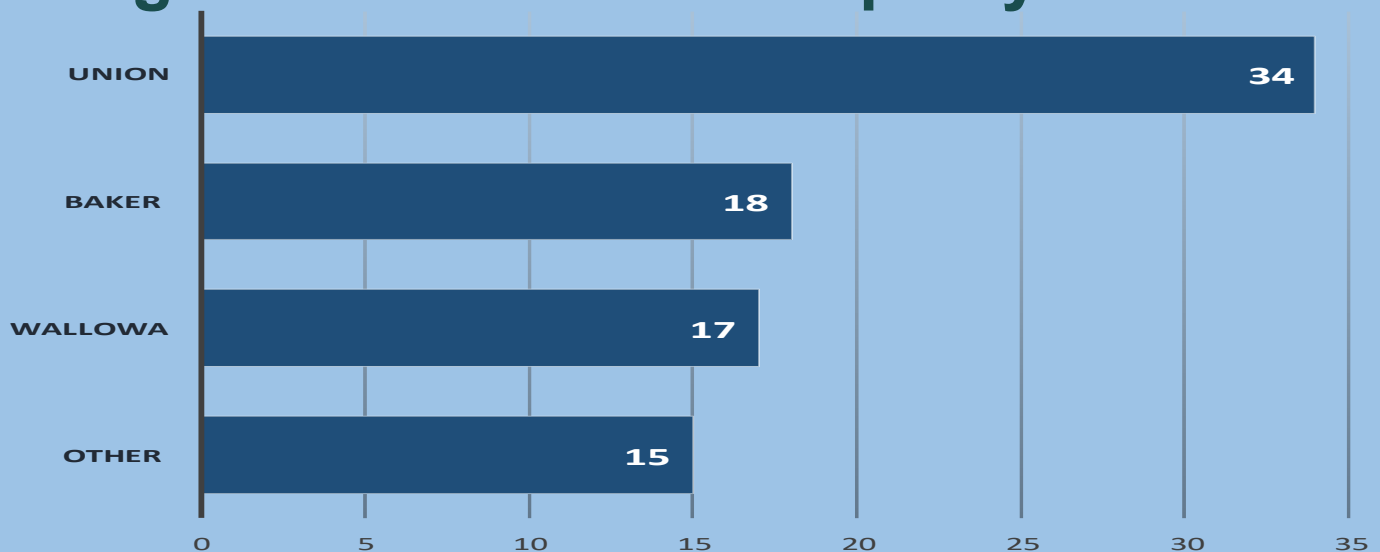

EOCRN Memberships Continue to Grow

Memberships from organizations and individuals continue to increase in EOCRN. Currently there are **237 members** from **84 organizations** enrolled representing Baker, Union and Wallowa Counties.

Membership to EOCRN is free and members can request needed items or materials for their clients or share resources they have.

In the past few weeks, fulfilled requests included a haircut, t-ball items, information about tax preparation, and bunk beds.

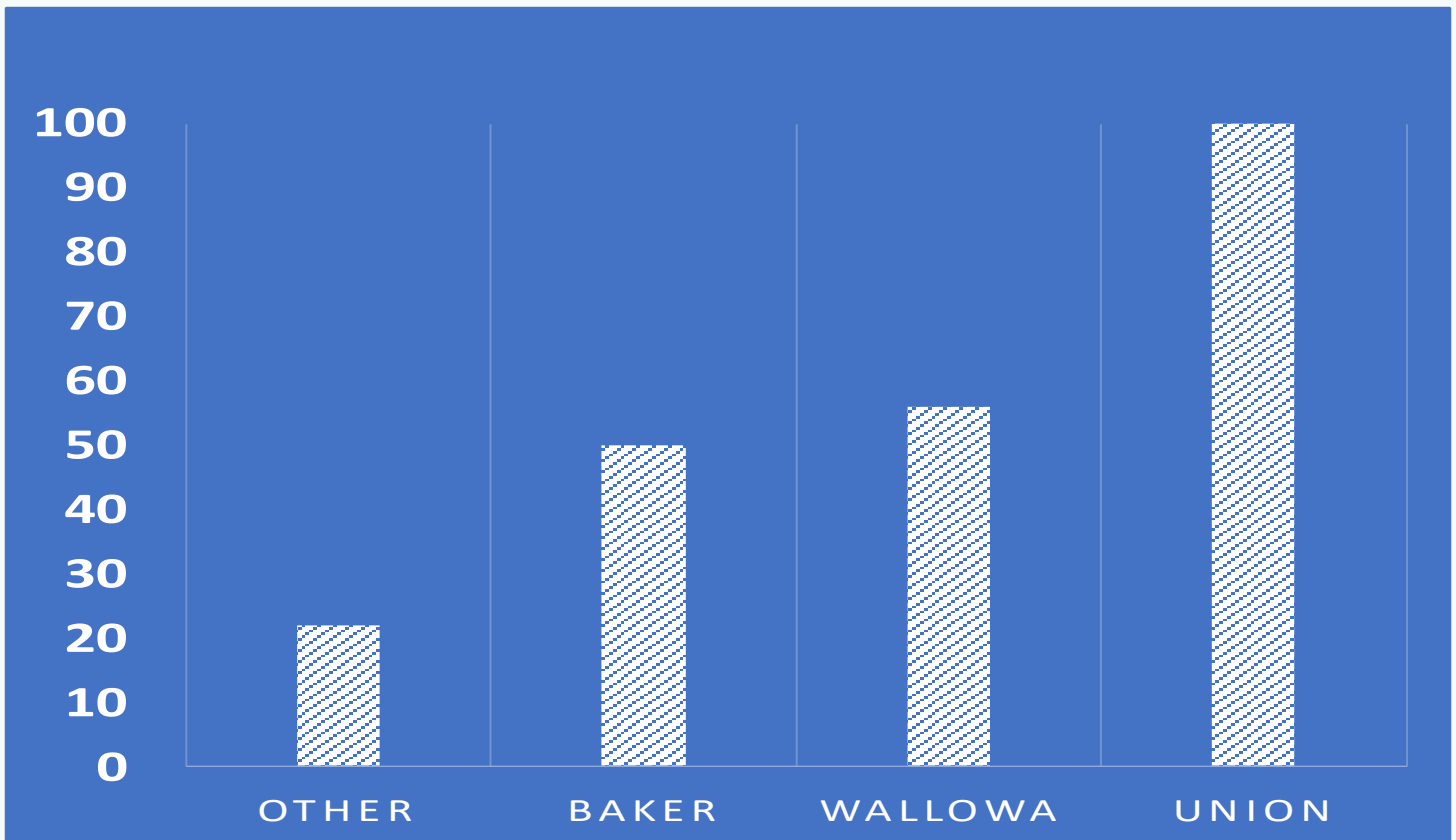
Closed shares that were fulfilled include couches, televisions, and furniture.

Items Currently Listed on EOCRN

Requests include beds, mattresses, 6" raised toilet seat, dumpsters, transportation, motel rooms, vehicle, household items, 5th wheel repairs, firewood, child care, storage bins, medication, plane ticket, car tire, water bill, and window repair.

Shares currently listed include a hospital bed, Laundry Love, mobility scooter, and children's pop up tent and tunnel.

Individual Memberships by County



The chart above breaks down membership per individuals. Union County has 102 members; Wallowa County 56 members; Baker County 53 members; and Other Counties total 26 members. Overall, Union County accounts for 43% of members followed by Wallowa County at 24%; Baker County at 22%; and 11% from other counties outside the area.
