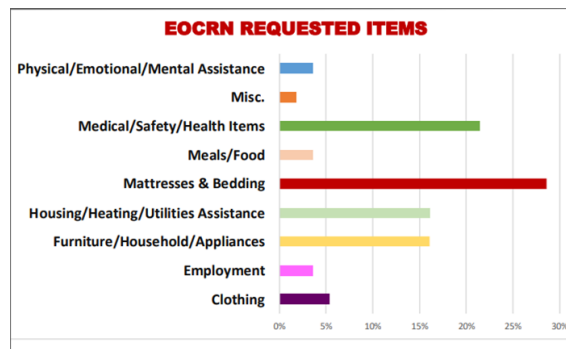


## EOCRN Survey

EOCRN was launched in October 2020. We are approaching our 1<sup>st</sup> anniversary soon. As of July 1<sup>st</sup> 2021, EOCRN has 156 Members from 65 Member Organizations. Since the launch of EOCRN, our members have fulfilled many requests. The graph below shows the requests under the various categories.

## Recent Fulfilled Requests

EOCRN has had 87 requests since launching last September. Seventy-five of those requests have been closed with 76% of them being successfully fulfilled and only 8% unfulfilled. The remaining 16% of requests were referred, withdrawn, deleted, or closed with an unknown status.

Some recent fulfilled closed requests:

- ◆ \$50 to Pay Off a Medical Bill;
- ◆ Prepaid Minutes Card for Straight Talk Plan;
- ◆ Sleeping Bag for Homeless 18 Year Old;
- ◆ Baby Items for Parent;
- ◆ Beds for a Family;
- ◆ Mattresses;
- ◆ Furniture;
- ◆ Bike for 6 Year Old.

## Community Spotlight: Double Up Food Bucks Oregon

**Double Up Food Bucks** is a program where purchases from Farmers Markets assist Oregon Trail Card SNAP participants in gaining access to fresh fruits and vegetables.

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) provides benefits to over 600,000 Oregonians. Farmers Markets in Baker, Union and Wallowa are participating in this program. For every dollar spent on SNAP eligible foods at Farmer's Markets, **Double Up Food Bucks** receive an additional dollar to spend on fruits and veggies grown in Oregon.



*“Get more fruits and vegetables when you spend your Oregon Trail Card SNAP dollars at participating farmers markets. It’s easy with Double Up Food Bucks! For example, if you spend \$10 of your SNAP dollars at a participating Farmers Market, we will give you another \$10 to buy more locally grown fruits and vegetables.”*

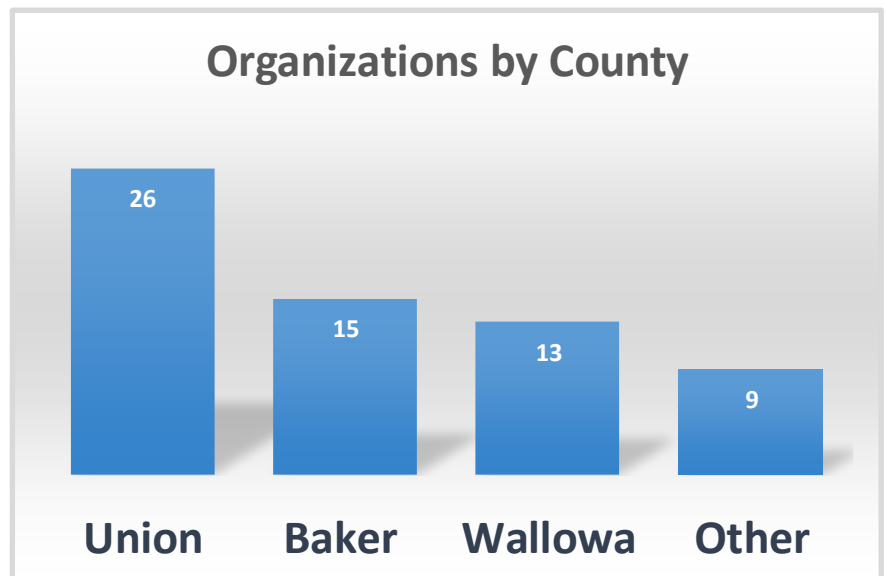

Farmers Markets in Wallowa, La Grande and Baker Counties all participate. SNAP funds can be matched up to \$20 each time. Each market can swipe an EBT card and exchange funds for shopping tokens. More information can be found here: <https://doubleuporegon.org/>

## Growing the EOARN Membership

Currently there are 65 organizations represented in EOARN. Member organizations come from social services, schools, medical entities, government agencies, businesses, and church entities. Community members are also represented in EOARN.

In the three counties, 41% of the organizations are from Union County, 24% from Baker County, 21% from Wallowa County, and 14% from other counties (Marion, Polk, Umatilla, Los Angeles, Grant).
